#### Parking

Just some advance information, Greater City of Shepparton Council, after parent/schools have discussed parking, especially drop off and pick up, the Council will be converting 9 x 2 hour parking bays to 15 minute parking bays between the times of 8.30 and 9.30am and 3pm and 4pm. #### **Security Cameras**

Our school has installed cameras around our school for security reasons. There is signage around the school informing the community of these cameras. These will certainly help protect the school.

#### Some tips on Cybersafety every parent should know keeping children safe on line

- 1. Nothing replaces parental supervision and education for children about cyber safety—Laptops, iPads should be used in loungerooms and kitchen areas where parents are around, and not in bedrooms.
- 2. Set a technology curfew.
- 3. Remind your child to never give out identifying information such as home address, school name or telephone number.
- 4. If your child posts photos online, use privacy settings to limit access to people they know well.
- 5. Reassure your child that they can tell you anything without fear of losing the laptop or internet access.
- 6. If they get a message or email that's threatening or rude, they should STOP, BLOCK, TELL. First step to tell your child to STOP responding to the abuse, then block those people sending threatening or rude messages. Let your child know if they are being bullied, they should tell a trusted adult.


# MJR FOCUS


